2022-23 Year-end Review and Work Plan 2023-24

Purpose

This paper reviews the work priorities of the Yau Tsim Mong District Office (“YTMDO”) of the Home Affairs Department (“HAD”) for 2022-23 and presents the work plan for 2023-24.

2022-23 Year-end Review

2. In 2022-23, the YTMDO continued to serve as a “**community connector**”, acting as a bridge between government departments and the Yau Tsim Mong District Council, and between various district-based advisory committees and residents in the district. We continued to work together with organisations and individuals in and beyond the district to promote community involvement, continue to “engage the community through sports”, dedicate ourselves to the youth and ethnic minority (“EM”) affairs, improve the community environment and participate in various inter-departmental initiatives (including anti-epidemic work). The key figures and activities are set out below.

3. In 2022-23, the YTMDO –
- supported 24 meetings of the Yau Tsim Mong District Council and its Committees;
 - supported over 30 meetings of district-based advisory committees and their sub-groups;
 - convened 7 meetings of the District Management Committee;
 - conducted over 650 district consultations;
 - contacted building organisations or residents more than 14 500 times;
 - assisted in the formation of 15 owners’ corporations;
 - approved nearly 220 applications for Community Involvement Programme (“CIP”);
 - organised or sponsored nearly 80 sports activities;
 - organised or sponsored nearly 100 youth activities;
 - supported nearly 45 EM activities;
 - endorsed 30 district minor works projects;
 - cleaned the common areas of nearly 320 old buildings;
 - coordinated nearly 250 operations to remove miscellaneous articles on streets;
 - coordinated nearly 20 operations to remove abandoned vehicles; and
 - opened temporary shelters for nearly 90 days/nights.

4. In 2022-23, the highlights/featured initiatives of the YTMDO are as follows –

- (I) coordinated **major inter-departmental operations to remove miscellaneous articles** (including Cherry Street and the large pedestrian subway linking Canton Road and Peking Road), with a view to tackling the persistent and thorny problem and coping with the increased number of visitors after the resumption of normal travel;
- (II) actively took forward the major district minor works projects, namely the “**Jordan Youth Space**”¹ and the “**Avenue of Sports Stars**”² at the Tsim Sha Tsui waterfront;
- (III) celebrated the 25th anniversary of **the establishment of the HKSAR** and the 73rd **National Day** through arts and culture, including –
 - A. co-planned a book entitled *Our Story of Yau Tsim Mong* with the team of Professor John LEE Chi-kin of the Education University of Hong Kong. The book was launched at a talk during the Hong Kong Book Fair 2022, allowing the public to know about Yau Tsim Mong District from various perspectives, and is a reflection of the close relationship between Hong Kong and our Country;
 - B. co-organised “**Chinese Culture Youth Musical in Celebration of the 25th Anniversary of Establishment of the HKSAR in Yau Tsim Mong**” with the Hong Kong Repertory Theatre at the Grand Theatre of the Hong Kong Cultural Centre. More than 20 schools in the district participated in the production, which was successfully staged for three performances to an audience of about 3 000. This was an example of collaboration among the Government, the local community, the arts and cultural sector and the education sector;
 - C. co-organised a **Chinese fan dance performance** with the Kowloon Women’s Organisations Federation next to the Hong Kong Palace Museum in the West Kowloon Cultural District to showcase the vibrancy of the district through

traditional Chinese culture, with over 1 000 women joining together to **break the Guinness World Record**;

- D. **beautified the pedestrian walkway** outside Mongkok Government Offices with **the theme** of pictures provided by authorities from all over the **Greater Bay Area** to help pedestrians learn more about the Greater Bay Area;
 - E. invited artists and community members to create a **large-scale festive mural** for display on the slopes outside Signal Hill Garden, Minden Row, Tsim Sha Tsui;
 - F. displayed **a sea of national and HKSAR flags** at tourist spots such as Park Lane Shopper’s Boulevard and Temple Street. The displays were a hot spot for photo-taking;
 - G. displayed **large-scale light decorations** in English, Chinese and EM languages, and erected **LED screens** at prominent locations along the roads to display the congratulatory messages;
 - H. co-organised a traditional celebratory performance “**Cantonese Opera Show 2022 in Celebration of the 25th Anniversary of the Establishment of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region**” with Yau Tsim Mong District Area Committees;
 - I. organised a seminar entitled “Dialogue with CEOs in the Greater Bay Area on the **Strengths of Hong Kong’s Youth under ‘One Country, Two Systems’**”, which allowed at-site and online interactions between Hong Kong and Nansha, Guangzhou and was broadcast live by RTHK attracting over 10 000 viewers;
- (IV) co-organised other activities with different youth and district organisations to **boost understanding of our Country from multiple perspectives**, details of which are in Annex 1;
- (V) **set up sports district teams**, including basketball youth district teams and continued to support the first cricket district team in Hong Kong³; made good use of the special venues in the district (including private sports clubs) to organise training courses on rugby, cricket and long-distance running, and co-organised activities on emerging sports, virtual sports (including golf), freestyle rope skipping, wrestling, karate and floor curling for people with disabilities. A list of **sports activities** organised or sponsored by the YTMDO is in Annex 2;

- (VI) promoted **special youth activities** such as youth festival⁴, busking, city orientation and overseas exchanges; continued the “Yau Tsim Mong Youth Network Programme”, which lasted for seven months, and the “Running Crew X Yau Tsim Mong Youth” project;
- (VII) set up an **Instagram** account (@ytm.youth), the first of its kind among districts, to introduce places to go in Yau Tsim Mong to young people, as well as promote youth-related information and enhance interaction with them, and launched a youth website;
- (VIII) as the **EM** population in Yau Tsim Mong District is the highest among the 18 districts, the YTMDO has reached out to them since 2020 with the objective of “information and inclusion”; organised cross-ethnic youth forums and assisted EMs to integrate into the community through Yau Tsim Mong Multicultural Activity Centre, a Signature Project, and the District-based Programmes for Racial Harmony. The YTMDO continued to work with the Yau Tsim Mong District Fire Safety Committee to distribute electric candles, household fire detectors, etc. to EM businesses and residents;
- (IX) continued to implement the pioneering **Fire Safety Direction Support Service Scheme** under the Yau Tsim Mong District-led Actions Scheme (“DAS”), assisting 27 buildings to obtain approval of engineering drawings, three buildings to comply with fire safety directions and seven owners’ corporations to be formed in 2022;
- (X) in the **Cleansing of Common Parts of Buildings** under the DAS, the YTMDO had cleaned 318 target buildings and cleared 26 tonnes of rubbish. To step up pest control work, starting from December 2022, the YTMDO has placed “T-shaped bait boxes for rodents” in the common parts of 70 buildings;
- (XI) took the lead in **spraying anti-virus coating** on over 550 old buildings in the district to effectively reduce the risk of spreading the novel coronavirus in the community;
- (XII) closely **followed up on the situation after the fires in buildings** (including the fire at the redevelopment site at Middle Road, Tsim Sha Tsui) and provided appropriate assistance to residents;

- (XIII) **renovated the hall of Henry G. Leong Yau Ma Tei Community Centre and installed a large stage LED screen** there and at Mong Kok Community Hall; and
- (XIV) actively supported various government efforts. Apart from anti-epidemic work, such as organising 22 **vaccination** activities and setting up a number of service stations for the distribution of **anti-epidemic service bags**, the YTMDO promoted the **World No Tobacco Day** in the district in response to the special recommendations of the then Food and Health Bureau; promoted and made contingency arrangements with the **Consumption Voucher Scheme** Secretariat to assist members of the public in registering or changing their particulars at its Mong Kok office; in response to the 2023 **earthquake in Türkiye**, the YTMDO also appealed to organisations to donate goods to help with the disaster, raising over 1 000 relief items.

Annual Work Plan 2023-24

5. The highlights/strategies in the annual plan of the YTMDO for the year 2023-24 are as follows:

- (I) Establish and support **20 District Services and Community Care Teams** tasked with routine care operations to care for the elderly and the young in the community, showing solidarity and increasing social capital, building public confidence and helping to deal with emergencies;
- (II) **Youth work:** in coordination with the Youth Development Blueprint:
- A. Establish the **District Youth Community Building Committee** and the **District Youth Development and Civic Education Committee**;
- B. Work with community groups and clansmen associations to organise more **study tours for the youth⁵ to the Mainland** to enhance young people's understanding of our Country;
- C. Organise again activities on **May Fourth** and **introduction to**

diplomacy (inviting representatives of the Office of the Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the HKSAR together with members of the HKSAR Delegation of Table Tennis to exchange views with young people);

- D. Continue to promote sports that are popular among youths, including **3×3 basketball**, and help to promote the urban sports centre in Kwun Chung as proposed in the Budget;
- E. Continue to promote **adventure training**, which had been added to the Yau Tsim Mong Youth Network Programme since 2021, to enhance resilience in young people;
- F. Provide **street performance** opportunities, including music and street dance in Mong Kok on 15 April, and identify other venues (e.g. Park Lane Shopper’s Boulevard); and
- G. Collaborate with the Yau Tsim Mong District Fight Crime Committee and the Police on developing a “**Monopoly**” board game themed on fraud prevention, and collaborate with the Yau Tsim Mong District Fire Safety Committee and the Fire Services Department to organise a **youth uniformed group** to receive training in Chinese-style foot drill and flag-raising;

(III) **District Minor Works:** proceed with Jordan Youth Space, Avenue of Sports Stars and plan various street beautification projects (including **beautification of the Mong Kok Road footbridge system** and Saigon Street pedestrian subway);

(IV) Community Involvement:

- A. Retain the five **priority themes** of the **CIP**, namely sports, culture, civic education, inclusion and old buildings, in response to community needs;
- B. **Capitalise on the advantages** of having arts and cultural infrastructure such as the West Kowloon Cultural District and the South Kowloon cultural belt⁶ to **further promote art**⁷;
- C. Strengthen cooperation with tertiary institutions in **Yau Tsim Mong**, as well as with Kowloon and **territory-wide organisations**⁸ based in Yau Tsim Mong to share resources;

- D. Continue to make use of Yau Tsim Mong Multicultural Activity Centre to strengthen ties with **EM** by organising inclusive bazaars, multicultural youth cycling team training, employment support workshops, EM festivals, etc;
- E. **Continue to engage the community through sports** by expanding the programme to include yoga⁹ and Tai Chi¹⁰; strengthen cooperation with the Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China (“SF&OC”) ¹¹and the Hong Kong Sports Association for the Physically Disabled;
- F. Ride on territory-wide events, such as **National Security Education Day**¹² and Happy Hong Kong¹³, and support **territory-wide major events** held in the district, including the Hong Kong Marathon, the Cross Harbour Race¹⁴, the Hong Kong Cyclothon, the Hong Kong Dragon Boat Carnival, and FIVB Volleyball Nations League – HK;
- G. Celebrate the **establishment of the HKSAR and the National Day**: including a Cantonese opera to be staged on 8 August at the Grand Theatre of the Hong Kong Cultural Centre in collaboration with four Area Committees;
- H. Organise thematic activities in collaboration with other district committees and organisations such as the Yau Tsim Mong **District Health Centre Express** and the Hong Kong Road Safety Patrol; and
- I. resume/initiate other **district-specific events**, including temple fairs, Yau Ma Tei Festival, Sycamore Street Festival,

Kong Red Cross, Hong Kong Youths Unified Association, Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, Hong Kong Youth Power Association, Hong Kong Federation of Education Workers, Kowloon Region School Heads Association and Kowloon Women's Organisations Federation.

etc¹⁵;

- (V) Continue to coordinate joint operations to clear miscellaneous items and abandoned vehicles in line with the **Government Programme on Tackling Hygiene Black Spots**; step up efforts to combat street obstruction by shops, and invite district committees to join in the publicity and education efforts;
- (VI) Promote the concept of good **building management** and continue to implement Yau Tsim Mong District Building Management Professional Advisory Scheme¹⁶ and Yau Tsim Mong DAS (**Fire Safety Direction Support Service Scheme** and **Cleansing of Common Parts of Buildings**);
- (VII) Continue to take forward with the relevant departments the inclusion of **two new community halls** at Hoi Ting Road Joint User Complex and the Sai Yee Street site in Mong Kok;
- (VIII) Complement the work subject to the outcome of the review on district administration.

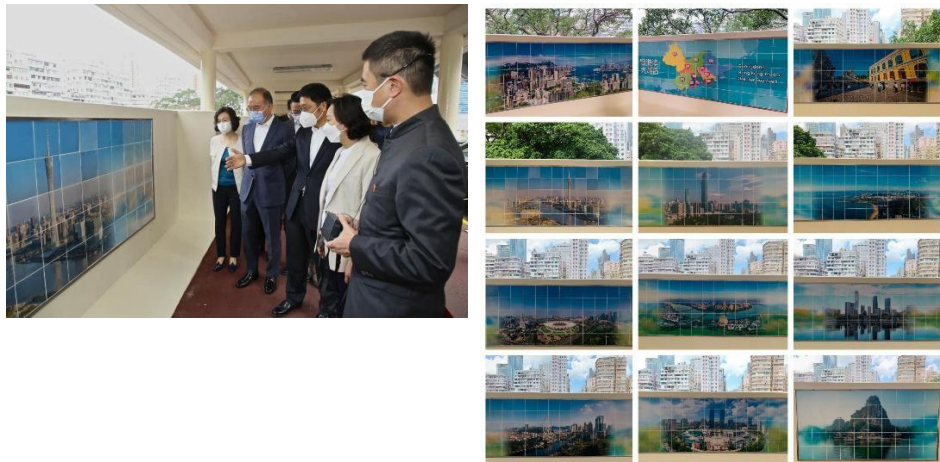
6. On 11 September 2022, the YTMDO co-organised a traditional Chinese costume show.



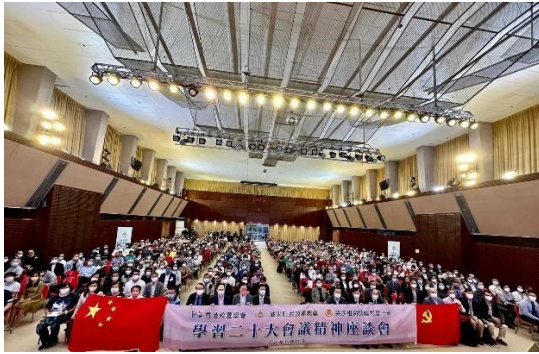
7. On 24 September 2022, the YTMDO organised a talk on the Spirit of President Xi Jinping’s Important Speech and National Security.



8. On 2 October 2022, the YTMDO unveiled the Greater Bay Area Walkway outside Mongkok Government Offices.



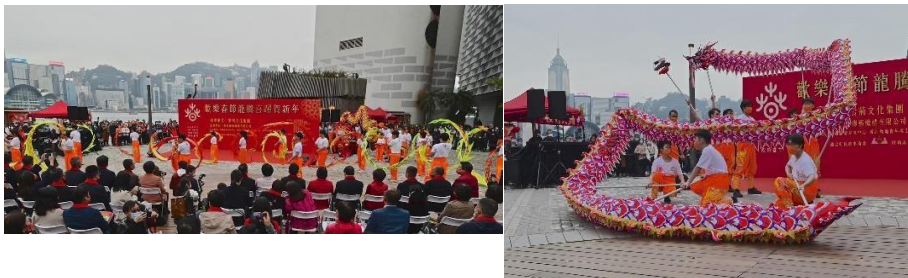
9. In November 2022, the YTMDO co-organised multiple seminars on Learning the Spirit of the 20th National Congress of CPC.
