

Summary of Services for the Sub-district:

A. Mandatory Services

1. Community Care

Ser	vice Requirement	Key Performance Indicator (KPI)
(a)	Set up communication channels of the Care Team with at least 2 channels, such as telephone, email, social media and instant messaging software, etc.	The relevant channels shall be opened within three weeks after the funding agreement takes effect, and shall be maintained until the end of the funding agreement.
(b)	Widely publicise the communication channels and services of the Care Team to the residents of the sub-district.	Publicise the communication channels and services of the Care Team in the sub-district, covering no less than 90% of the residents of the sub-district within three months after the funding agreement takes effect.
(c)	Establish a liaison network with the residents of the sub-district, facilitating the residents to contact the Care Team and assisting the Government to deliver information to the residents so as to strengthen ties with the residents.	Distribute in a timely manner the important information provided by the Government through the liaison network between the Care Team and the residents of the sub-district as required by the Government or as needed. Within one year after the funding agreement takes effect, the established liaison network shall cover not less than 15% of the households of the sub-district.

Provide information/services to at least 300 elderly households.
(e)	Visit/contact other households in need in the sub-district, establish contacts, and provide basic services for the households, including providing information on public/social welfare/medical/other related services, assisting in applying for or making appointment for the above services, providing basic information technology assistance, and assisting in arranging the households in need to receive home or other support services in item (f) or referrals to relevant departments/organisations for professional services.	Provide information/services to at least 400 households in need.
(f)	Depending on the circumstances of the sub- district, provide home or other support services to those in need (such as simple home repairs/cleaning, health talks, "Share and Care" activities like collection of old clothes for donation, recruiting and training residents to be volunteers to serve other people in need, etc.).	Provide 110 times of services to people in need.
