

Guidelines for Electors

The Elections (Corrupt and Illegal Conduct) Ordinance ("Ordinance"), enforced by the ICAC, aims to uphold clean and fair elections. The Ordinance is applicable to the Rural Representative Election (including ordinary elections and by-elections) and the elections to elect the Chairmen, Vice-Chairmen and members of the Executive Committees of Rural Committees, as well as members of the Heung Yee Kuk.

According to the Ordinance, an elector **MUST NOT** within Hong Kong or elsewhere:

- ◆ Solicit or accept any advantage (including money, gift, etc.), food, drink or entertainment from any person for not voting at an election, or voting or not voting for a particular candidate or particular candidates;
- Offer any advantage (including money, gift, etc.), food, drink or entertainment to any person as an inducement to or a reward for the latter not to vote at an election, or to vote or not to vote for a particular candidate or particular candidates;
- Use or threaten to use force or duress against any person for inducing the latter to vote or not to vote at an election; or to vote or not to vote for a particular candidate or particular candidates;
- ◆ Vote at an election knowing that he/she is not entitled to do so (for instance, if registered electors of the Resident Representative Election and the Kaifong Representative Election no longer reside in the Village or Market Town for which they are registered, or their residential addresses in the Village or Market Town are no longer their sole or main homes, they are no longer eligible to remain registered as electors. The persons concerned will commit an offence if they vote at an election); or after having knowingly or recklessly given false or misleading information (e.g. false "principal residential address") to an electoral officer.
